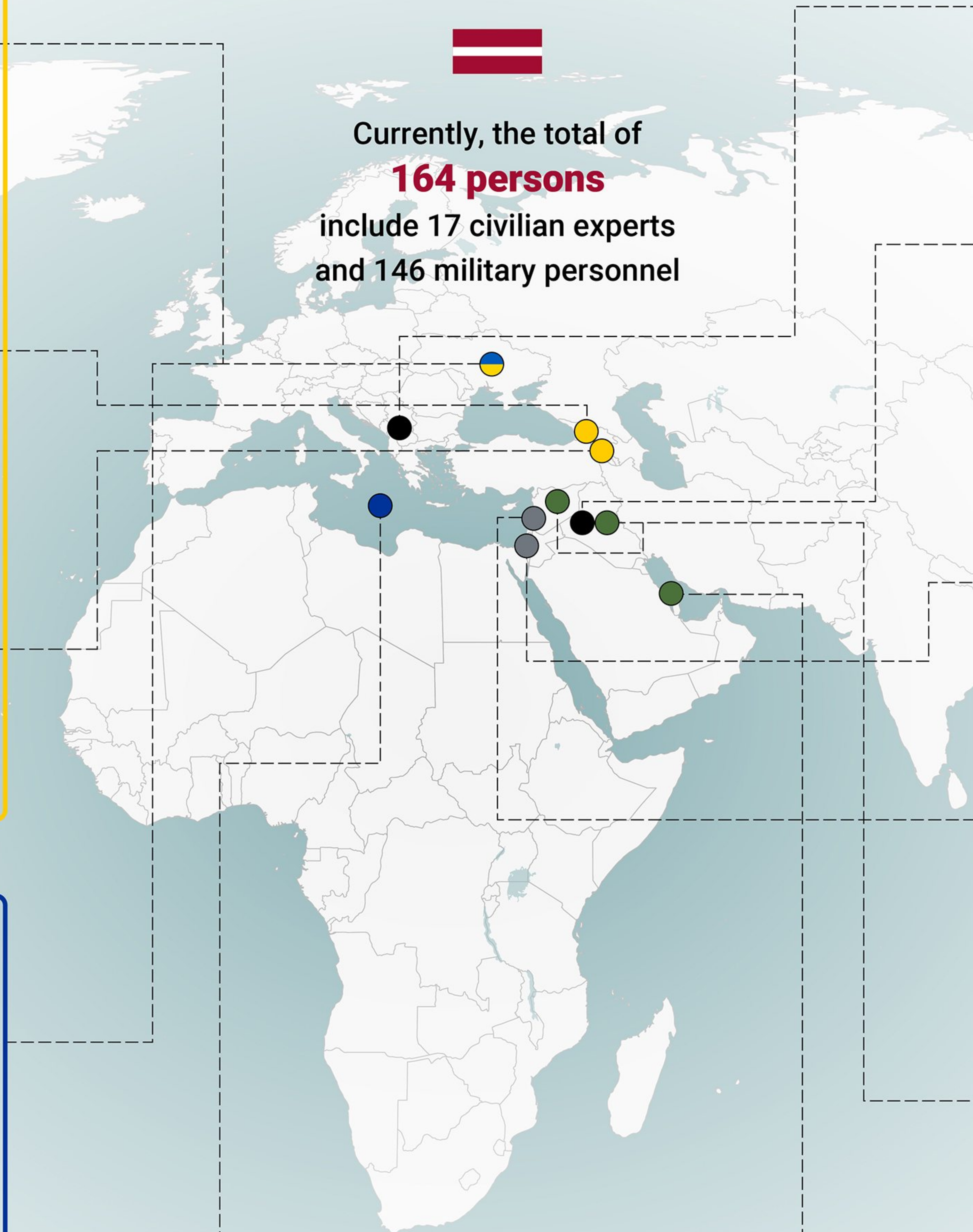


Latvia's Contribution to International Missions and Operations, and other formats



Currently, the total of **164 persons** include 17 civilian experts and 146 military personnel



The European Union's civilian missions



The EU Advisory Mission Ukraine (EUAM Ukraine)



4 civilian experts

The mission aims to support Ukraine in the field of civilian security sector reform, including justice and home affairs, as well as to facilitate investigation of war crimes and restoration of the rule of law in the liberated territories.



The EU Monitoring Mission Georgia (EUMM Georgia)



12 civilian experts

The mission is the only international monitor for the Russia-Georgia Six Point Ceasefire Agreement. The mission facilitates reduction of tension between the parties to the conflict, promotes stabilisation and normalisation of the situation.



EU Mission in Armenia (EUMA)



1 civilian expert

The mission is tasked with facilitating reduction in the number of incidents in the conflict-affected border regions between Armenia and Azerbaijan and lowering the risk levels for people living there, thereby promoting the normalisation of relations between the two countries.



The European Union's military operations

EU Military Assistance Mission Ukraine (EUMAM Ukraine)

In 2023, Latvia trained 1600 Ukrainian soldiers. The same numbers are to be trained as part of the mission in 2024.



2 military personnel

The EU operation in the Mediterranean (EUNAVFOR MED IRINI)

The operation's core task of the operation is monitoring of the implementation of the UN arms embargo through the use of aerial, satellite and maritime assets.



NATO operations



NATO Mission in Kosovo (Kosovo Force - (KFOR))

136 military personnel

Main tasks - patrolling, protecting their forces, maintaining combat capabilities, training, and rapid response tasks.



NATO Mission Iraq (NMI)

3 military personnel

The mission provides expertise in security/defence sector reform, institution building and helping to strengthen Iraqi security forces and Iraqi military education institutions at the same time providing additional support to Iraq's efforts to stabilize the country and fight terrorism.



United Nation Missions



UN Peacekeeping - United Nations Truce Supervision Organization (UNTSO) Middle East

1 military person

One headquarters officer deployed in Jerusalem, Israel. Main tasks of the mission: supervise armistice agreements, prevent isolated incidents from escalating.



The United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL)

3 military personnel

The mission is tasked with sustaining the security situation in southern Lebanon and monitoring the cessation of hostilities in the region.

Other operations



1 military person

The Global Coalition against Daesh

The coalition is committed to: strengthening international security; stabilising liberated areas in Syria and Iraq; countering Daesh's propaganda; repatriation and rehabilitation of former foreign terrorist fighters and their family members.



International Maritime Security Construct

The multinational coalition aims to ensure the freedom of navigation and a free flow of international trade in the Persian Gulf, the Strait of Hormuz, the Gulf of Oman, and the Bab-el-Mandeb Strait.
