

TOTAL AID TO UKRAINE

SINCE THE BEGINNING OF THE WAR UP TO 31TH DECEMBER, 2025

Latvia's GDP (prognoses):

160.7 billion € (2022 – 12/2025)

Total aid to Ukraine:

1.06 billion € (0.6% of GDP),
which includes:

■ **Military aid to Ukraine:**
665 million €

■ **Support to Ukrainian
civilians in Latvia:**
296 million €

■ **Humanitarian aid and support
to the Government of Ukraine:**
90 million €

■ **Reform, development,
reconstruction support:**
16 million €

■ Military aid

Government of Latvia: various military equipment, anti-aircraft missiles, helicopters, howitzers, drones, weapons and personal equipment, dry food rations, ammunition, anti-tank weapons, fuel, etc.

Contribution to NATO Comprehensive Assistance Package for Ukraine, as well as NATO Prioritised Ukraine Requirements List (PURL) initiative.

Private sector & Civil society: military generators, drones, drone catchers, drone 3D tails, quadricycles, military scooters, off-road vehicles, generators, camouflage nets, canned game, trench candles, walkie-talkies, etc.

■ Support to Ukrainian Civilians in Latvia

Support to Ukrainian Civilians in Latvia Act: residence and working permits, grants for employment, start-up allowances, Guaranteed Minimum Income Allowances, state allowances for families, monthly childcare allowances, scholarships, student and children camps, language and culture courses.

■ Humanitarian Aid and Support to the Government of Ukraine

Government of Latvia: humanitarian aid and support for the Government of Ukraine, including medical equipment, support to critical infrastructure (generators and transformers etc.), etc.

International contributions (grants and guarantees): International Bank for Reconstruction and Development, World Bank programmes for Ukraine, European Investment Bank, European Bank For Reconstruction and Development, International Monetary Fund, Grain from Ukraine initiative, International Criminal Court, UN funds (children, women and refugees), European Organisation for the Safety of Air Navigation (EUROCONTROL), OECD, OSCE, Council of Europe Register of Damage for Ukraine, Ukraine Energy Support Fund (Energy Community), The HALO Trust demining organization etc.

Local Governments: vehicles (cars, buses, etc.), PCs, transformers, generators, medicines and medical equipment, humanitarian aid, camouflage nets and trench candles, children and youth camps.

Private sector & Civil society: humanitarian aid and medical aid, food and hygiene goods, baby food and diapers, medicines, dressing materials, equipment and beds for hospitals, warm clothing, sun panels, micro-generation stations, batteries and charging stations, portable and desktop PCs.

■ Support for Reform, Development, Reconstruction

Government of Latvia: restoration of social infrastructure (educational and healthcare facilities), building air raid shelters, establishment of support, rehabilitation and resilience centres, establishing a Ukrainian Ombudsman's Human Rights Protection Centre in Chernihiv, reconstruction of housing, Latvian experts' support for planning and overseeing the reconstruction process, involvement of Latvian businesses in reconstruction.

Government of Latvia (through MFA): grants for development cooperation projects in Ukraine, covering areas, such as good governance and administrative capacity building, strengthening the rule of law, decentralization, fighting corruption and disinformation, support for civil society and democratic engagement, support to independent media, support for war victims (including rehabilitation), strengthening agriculture and export capacity, support for the establishment of medical rehabilitation system, educational programs for Ukrainian young professionals and civil servants.
