

RUSSIA'S ILLEGAL ANNEXATION OF CRIMEA

18 March 2014:

Russia illegally annexed the Autonomous Republic of Crimea and the city of Sevastopol - a violation of the territorial integrity of Ukraine

27 March 2014:

United Nations General Assembly adopted Resolution 68/262 'Territorial integrity of Ukraine'. All EU Member States vote for resolution
